











- The first airport train in Indonesia




Medan-Kualanamu-Tebing Tinggi Toll Road



KNO TRAFFIC PASSANGER FORECAST





KNO DOMESTIC EXISTING ROUTES

Domestic Routes There were 26 domestic routes from KNO in 2019, according to OAG. The top destination was Jakarta Soekarno-Hatta (CGK) with 1.87 million departing seats. When combined with Jakarta's other airport, Halim Perdanakusuma Airport (HLP), the Medan - Jakarta route makes up almost half (48%) of all domestic seats at Medan. Apart from being the capital city, Jakarta CGK acts as a hub for passengers to travel to other domestic airports, as well as international destinations. 
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KNO POTENTIAL DOMESTIC NEW ROUTES

Surabaya, Denpasar-Bali, Pontianak and Makassar are high in demand but currently have few direct flights from KNO.

Potential Demand for New Domestic Routes

- MIDT data provides the full routing of the passenger, and therefore their ultimate destination, allowing for the identification of potentially untapped routes that could have the demand to launch direct services.
- Analysis of MIDT data indicates that the top six destinations from KNO are well served by direct flights.
- However, looking at the next top destination Surabava, there was an estimated total of 266,000 passengers flying there but only 84,000 flew direct from KNO between in 2019. Over 182,000 passengers (68%) flew indirectly, of which over half flew via Jakarta CGK.
- Other popular destinations where a large proportion of passengers flew indirectly from KNO are also domestic destinations: Denpasar, Pontianak and Makassar.

KNO INTERNATIONAL EXISTING ROUTES

International Routes

- In 2019 there were nine international destinations according to OAG schedules data:
 - 72% of international seat capacity was to Malaysia (Kuala Lumpur and Penang)
 - 14% was to Singapore
- In the past ten years, smaller routes were often introduced for a few years and subsequently removed, e.g.
 - Ipoh, Malaysia Re-introduced in March 2018, with an average of three flights per week (on Malindo Airways) and removed in 2019.
 - Phuket, Thailand Flights only scheduled in 2009-2010
- New & ceased routes
 - Hong Kong Cathay Dragon launched to Medan in November 2018 (three flights per week) but ceased in September 2019.
 - Amsterdam Introduced in October 2019 by Garuda Indonesia but the airline plans to replace Denpasar-Medan-Amsterdam with Jakarta-Amsterdam service, effective 18-Feb-2020.
 - London Introduced in July 2019 by Garuda Indonesia but the airline plans to replace Denpasar-Medan-London with Jakarta-London service, effective March 2020.

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KNO POTENTIAL INTERNATIONAL NEW ROUTES

A few international routes, such as Hong Kong, Chennai, Seoul and Taipei potentially have sufficient demand for opening new direct routes.

Potential Demand for New International Routes

- Kuala Lumpur, Penang, Singapore and Bangkok are well served by direct flights from KNO, with only low proportions of passengers flying indirectly (circa. 1.5%).
- At the time of production there were no direct flights to Hong Kong (Cathay dragon ceased in Sep19). Almost 20,860 passengers flew there indirectly, which suggests there is some demand for this destination that may be met by the carriers with a direct service during the concession period.
- Similarly, there are no direct routes to Chennai and Seoul. For Chennai, Airasia is the largest carrier to transfer the demand via their hub in Kuala Lumpur. Singapore airlines is the largest carrier to transfer the demand to Seoul via Singapore. Both routes have potential to capture the current indirect demand and launch direct flights.
- Other East Asian cities have some demand, but these are possibly insufficient to justify opening new direct routes currently, but Chennai, Seoul and Taipei have potential.




